# Keep Iowa Beautiful Hometown Pride/Gilmore City Community

## **Projects**

Gilmore City, as tiny as it is, packs a powerful punch when it comes to having committed volunteers who have worked for years to continually beautify and better their little town. In 2012, Gilmore City was invited to join 8 neighboring communities in an incredible opportunity to improve our communities. The Keep Iowa Beautiful Hometown Pride program focuses on enhancing community cultural and economic vitality with initiatives for improvements to facilities, signage, community entryways, and encouraging youth service learning.

We have been working with a HP Community Coach, Margo Underwood, who has been instrumental in encouraging us to take a comprehensive approach to challenges unique to our town. With her help, we have the drive to keep moving forward with plans to continue working together for a common goal. The group of communities include Gilmore City, Fonda, Havelock, Laurens, Palmer, Plover, Pocahontas, Rolfe, and Varina. On our local level we have been able to provide new playground equipment, lighting, picnic tables and benches, trash receptacles, painted various public buildings, plant trees and install a new limestone sign for Sunset Park. On a broader level, some of the common goals with these communities are a county wide walking trail and community art projects.

Each group must apply for their own grant money to contribute toward their projects. There's no guarantee that any group will receive what they ask for and most grants require matching funds. In December of 2018, Russ Naeve and his sister, Janelle Rittgers were looking for a way to benefit Gilmore City in a way that would honor the memory of their mother and discovered a new opportunity within the Pocahontas County Foundation. A new fund had been established with the sole purpose of funding community projects. Contributions to the Gilmore City Community Projects Fund enable the group to raise the matching funds to complete and improve our goals.

We've been so blessed and humbled by the donations made not only by residents, but also corporate contributors and even people who don't live in Iowa, but who have ties to GC in one form or fashion.
